

**FIRST AMENDMENT TO  
INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT**

Between the

**UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF STATE  
(Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs, Office of Iraq Assistance)**

and the

**UNITED STATES ARMY  
Corps of Engineers**

for

**O&M Sustainment and Technical Capacity Development for Electricity, Water,  
Health, Transportation, and Communication**

**I. PURPOSE**

This document amends the "Interagency Acquisition Agreement Between the United States Department of State (Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs, Office of Iraq Assistance) and the United States Army Corps of Engineers for O&M Sustainment and Technical Capacity Development for Electricity, Water, Health, Transportation, and Communication" (IAA) to deobligate \$8,027,325 in unexpended FY 2006 Supplemental Economic Support Funds (ESF).

**II. STATEMENT OF WORK**

1. The United States Army Corps of Engineers shall continue to provide personnel and services to accomplish the activities outlined in paragraphs 1 through 7 of section III of the IAA, consistent with the revised budget estimate in paragraph 2 below.

2. Paragraph 8 of section III of the IAA is amended to read as follows:  
"The program will consist of \$ 336,972,675 to be implemented in accordance with the following budget estimate:

<u>Sector</u>	<u>O&amp;M Program</u>	<u>Technical Training Program</u>
• Electricity	\$228 million	\$25 million
• Water & Sanitation	\$ 32 million	\$15 million
• Health Care	\$ 12 million	\$ 3,972,675
• Transportation	\$ 7 million	\$ 6 million
• <u>Communication</u>	<u>\$ 6 million</u>	<u>\$ 2 million</u>
Total	\$285 million	\$51,972,675 "

4. Paragraphs 9 through 13 of Section III of the IAA shall continue to apply to the funding that remains obligated, as set forth in Section IV of this amendment to the IAA.

**III. AUTHORITIES AND RESTRICTIONS**

**A. Authorities**

This amendment to the IAA is undertaken pursuant to the authority of Part II, Chapter 4 of the Foreign Assistance Act, as amended (FAA), and funding as provided in Title I, Chapter 3 of the Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global War on Terror, and Hurricane Recovery, 2006 (P.L. 109-234) (FY06 Supplemental), which provides Economic Support Funds for Iraq, Section 632(b) of the FAA, 22 U.S.C. 2392, and 10 U.S.C. 3036(d)(2).

**B. Restrictions and Responsibilities**

Section IV.B. of the IAA shall continue to apply to the funding that remains obligated as set forth in Section IV of this amendment to the IAA.

**IV. DEOBLIGATION OF FUNDS**

Of the funds obligated in the IAA, \$8,027,325 is herein deobligated by this amendment to the IAA.

**V. EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERM OF THE AMENDMENT**

This amendment becomes effective upon the date of signature of both Parties.

**VI. CONTINUITY OF PROVISIONS**

Sections VII (Termination), VIII (Liability), IX (Reporting Requirements), X (Modifications), XI (Resolving Disagreements) and XII (Responsible Officials) of the IAA shall continue to apply to all work carried out under the IAA, as modified pursuant to this amendment.

**V. EFFECTIVE DATE AND TERM OF THE AMENDMENT**


This amendment becomes effective upon the date of signature of both Parties.
