

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Between the

Office of Research and Development  
of the Central Intelligence Agency

*Jan 93*

and

The Topographic Engineering Center  
of the United States Army Corps of Engineers

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into by and between the Office of Research and Development of the Central Intelligence Agency, (Intelligence Agency) and the Topographic Engineering Center of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, (Engineering Agency) for the purpose of cooperating in the research, development, and use of remote sensing technologies as may now or in the future be researched, developed, and used by one or both Agencies.

Whereas, the Congress has and may authorize and appropriate funds for the Intelligence Agency and the Engineering Agency for the purpose of developing and using the remote sensing technologies.

Whereas, the Intelligence Agency and the Engineering Agency have under constant review the available remote sensing technologies which might be appropriate for cooperative development or use by both agencies.

Whereas, the Agencies, through past cooperative efforts, recognize their mutual resources and capabilities relative to the remote sensing technologies.

Now therefore, this MOA is entered into for the purpose of improving the effectiveness of both Agencies through the cooperative efforts of the parties to develop and use the remote sensing technologies.


The Intelligence Agency and the Engineering Agency agree as follows:

1. The Intelligence Agency and the Engineering Agency shall cooperate with one another to facilitate the development and use of the remote sensing technologies to improve the mission effectiveness of the agencies. The parties agree to meet periodically to plan and discuss the progress of the remote sensing technologies, to share relevant information, and to provide such consultation and advice as may be appropriate.
2. Nothing in this MOA shall be construed to require either government agency to obligate funds for this purpose. All efforts anticipated to be undertaken under this MOA are subject to the availability of funds and to the

willingness of each Agency to expend those funds for the purpose of this MOA.

3. The Intelligence Agency and the Engineering Agency shall conclude an Cooperative Statement of Work (CSOW) for each mutual effort. The CSOW shall identify individual project managers and describe in detail the scope of the technical assistance to be provided, schedules for deliverables, necessary funding arrangements, and such other particulars as are necessary to describe clearly the obligations of the parties with respect to the requested services.
4. The parties recognize that appropriate security procedures shall be applied to any sensitive or national security information which may be provided or created pursuant to this MOA. Such information shall be provided only to appropriately cleared personnel and handled and protected accordingly.
5. Each Agency shall have the sole right and responsibility to apply for, obtain, and maintain patents or other forms of protection in the United States or other countries for technology or intellectual property developed by that Agency pursuant to this MOA.
6. This MOA shall commence upon the date the last signatory signs this document. The MOA will have an indefinite duration, though it may be reviewed periodically and revised upon the mutual consent of both parties. All modifications to this MOA shall be incorporated as written documents to the MOA. This MOA may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice to either party. In the event of termination, except by mutual agreement, each Agency shall fulfill obligations already entered into.

3. BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION.

A. During an 8 Jun 92 briefing to MG Arthur E. Williams, then Director, Civil Works, HQUSACE, by COL Murphy, CERD-ZB, it was determined that the existing MOA between CETEC and CIA needed to be updated.

B. COL Kessler, Commander and Deputy Director, CETEC requested that a new MOA be drafted for ASA(CW) approval.

C. The work conducted under the existing MOA and the new work anticipated under its proposed replacement will be conducted by CETEC or under CETEC's management.

D. The Cooperative efforts which are the subject of the existing and proposed replacement MOA are between CETEC and the CIA's Office of Research and Development (ORD). I request that you delegate to me the authority to authorize Mr. Walter E. Boge, Director, CETEC, to be the signatory of the MOA.

E. Draft Agreement has been coordinated with Kevin Cook of your office and Alex Ward of Army General Council.

4. IMPACTS. This agreement provides the framework for exchanges of data and technology and does not impact work units or manhours.


