SUBJECT: Participating Agency Service Agreement (PASA) No. 267-P-00-03-00001-12

1. The purpose of this memorandum is to transmit the final report required by the subject PASA. The final report summarizes the activities of the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to provide engineering and technical services to US Agency for International Development (USAID) for the construction oversight of the USAID infrastructure reconstruction program in Iraq. Six copies of the report with appendices are located on the enclosed compact disks and provided along with one hard copy of the main text. Additional copies of the report are available upon request.
2. USACE accomplishments under the PASA during the contract period from 19 May 2003 to 31 July 2007, include the following:
 - a. Developed and implemented a plan for construction oversight for two large construction contracts with a combined value of \$2.3 billion in infrastructure reconstruction;
 - b. Assisted in prioritization, selection, construction surveillance, pre-final and final inspections, closeout and transfer of the completed works to the end user for 105 Job Orders;
 - c. Established and successfully staffed four resident engineer offices to perform construction oversight and document site visits to assess and verify contractor performance in Mosul/Kirkuk, Baghdad, Hillah and Basrah. Conducted and documented 6,412 site visits to monitor Contractor performance during the life of the PASA.
 - d. The USACE, Cold Regions Research and Engineering Laboratory (CRREL) created and then supported a web-based ORACLE database for tracking 105 contractor Job Orders and storing 262,892 project documents and other information for \$2.3 billion in infrastructure reconstruction.
 - e. Provided 8 environmental compliance documents to USAID for review and approval in support of the USAID infrastructure program.
3. Remaining actions under the PASA include completion of final disposition of USAID accountable property and financial closeout.
